

SVS BROWN SHIPLEY INCOME FUND

Factsheet to 31 October 2025

Fund Objective

The Fund aims to achieve returns through a focus on assets the Investment Manager believes will generate income, as well as capital growth, over the medium term (at least five years). The Fund will invest, directly and indirectly, in a mixture of shares and fixed interest securities (being sovereign, investment grade and non-investment grade bonds). The allocation between the shares and fixed interest securities in which the Fund invests will be actively managed and will vary in response to short term market conditions. However, the allocation to shares, will remain within a 20% to 60% range. The Fund excludes issuers that derive more than 10% of revenue from thermal coal extraction or power generation, those that are involved in controversial weapons, issuers subject to EU arms embargoes and those that are deemed in violation of the UN Global Compact principles for over 3 years. In addition, the Fund integrates environmental, social and governance (ESG) factors in its investment process.

Commentary

October was generally a positive month for markets with more growth orientated regions and sectors leading the way. Progress on trade talks between the US and China towards the end of month supported sentiment, whilst better (lower) inflation numbers in the US also helped markets.

In equities, Japanese stocks were strong following the election of a new Prime Minister whilst Asia ex Japan markets were boosted by US/China trade talk developments. UK stocks benefitted from falling gilt yields and a strong commodity market. US equites ended up just over 2% for the month.

Bond markets were generally lead by the higher risk components of the market. Emerging market debt outperformed developed market fixed income, whilst high yield bonds outperformed investment grade debt over the month. As mentioned, UK gilt yields fell (prices rose) following positive comments from the Bank of England and softer inflation data.

Over the month we made a number of changes to the portfolio. We added exposure to US equities as the region remains supported by strong company earnings alongside expectations for further interest rate cuts. The majority of the increase in US equity exposure was implemented using currency hedged investments given our view that the USD is likely to weaken.

We also sold the low cost global minimum volatility equity fund during the month. We feel that minimum volatility strategies offer limited upside in the current market environment

Overall the portfolio continues to have moderate equity overweight over bonds whilst remaining well diversified across regions, sectors and investment styles.
