

# SVS BROWN SHIPLEY INCOME FUND

## Fund Objective

The Fund aims to achieve returns through a focus on assets the Investment Manager believes will generate income, as well as capital growth, over the medium term (at least five years). The Fund will invest, directly and indirectly, in a mixture of shares and fixed interest securities (being sovereign, investment grade and non-investment grade bonds). The allocation between the shares and fixed interest securities in which the Fund invests will be actively managed and will vary in response to short term market conditions. However, the allocation to shares, will remain within a 20% to 60% range. The Fund excludes issuers that derive more than 10% of revenue from thermal coal extraction or power generation, those that are involved in controversial weapons, issuers subject to EU arms embargoes and those that are deemed in violation of the UN Global Compact principles for over 3 years. In addition, the Fund integrates environmental, social and governance (ESG) factors in its investment process.

## Commentary

Markets posted modest gains in December, helped by stronger performance in Europe and Asia, while U.S. equities lagged. Defensive assets, particularly gold, continued to benefit from risk-averse investor demand and delivered strong returns.

Equity markets made steady progress in December, with stronger gains in Europe and Asia Pacific ex-Japan as performance widened geographically and sector-wise beyond U.S. mega-caps. U.S. equities struggled partly due to volatility in the technology sector and mixed investor sentiment. Cyclical and value sectors outperformed across several regions.

Bond markets had a mixed month in December as long-dated government bond yields rose, leading to modestly negative returns for global sovereign debt. Corporate bonds held up better, supported by tightening credit spreads and steady investor demand.

Over the month, we increased our allocation to UK gilts while reducing exposure to Japanese Government Bonds (JGBs), reflecting diverging policy paths. The UK's tighter budget stance and expected rate cuts provide a supportive backdrop for gilt

prices, whereas Japan's sizeable stimulus package and potential interest-rate hikes create headwinds for JGBs.


In equities, we took some profits from our Japanese exposure on the back of strong performance driven more by valuation expansion than earnings growth, unlike in the U.S., where earnings remain the primary driver. Finally, we increased our exposure to emerging-market equities, supported by attractive valuations, improving Chinese growth and a weaker U.S. dollar, while also providing diversification beyond the dominant AI theme.


