

SVS BROWN SHIPLEY BALANCED FUND

Factsheet to 30 November 2025

Fund Objective

The Fund aims to achieve growth through a combination of capital and income over the medium term (at least five years). The Fund will invest, directly and indirectly, in a mixture of shares and fixed interest securities (being sovereign, investment grade and non-investment grade bonds). The allocation between the shares and fixed interest securities in which the Fund invests will be actively managed and will vary in response to short term market conditions. However, the Fund operates a balanced strategy, maintaining a balance between shares and fixed interest securities, with the allocation to shares remaining within a 40% to 85% range. The Fund excludes issuers that derive more than 10% of revenue from thermal coal extraction or power generation, those that are involved in controversial weapons, issuers subject to EU arms embargoes and those that are deemed in violation of the UN Global Compact principles for over 3 years. In addition, the Fund integrates environmental, social and governance (ESG) factors in its investment process.

Commentary

Markets generally took a breather in November with returns from most asset classes hovering a few percent either side of zero over the month. Defensive investments tended to lead the way as investors showed some caution on the back of valuation concerns and uncertainty following the US government shut

Equity markets saw Japan lead the way, supported by a weaker Yen, whilst US equities were largely flat, despite a good third quarter earnings season. UK equities were also broadly unchanged over the period. By investment style, value outperformed growth over the month.

Bond markets had a relatively muted month with uncertainty regarding the next step in US interest rates keeping investors on the sidelines. UK market focus was on the Budget which, in the end, threw up fewer surprises than some had anticipated. Gilts were generally supported by the Chancellor's plans with yields broadly falling (prices rising) over the period.

Over the month we sold the gold exposure in the portfolio given the precious metal had reached our year end forecast. We felt that the recent rally in the gold price had been primarily driven by speculative flows rather than Central Bank buying. The proceeds were reinvested into UK gilts.

We also switched our Japanese Government Bond (JGB) exposure into the equivalent GBP hedged units. The holding offers a pick up in yield for GBP investors and remains a diversifier in the portfolio given the safe-haven status of the asset class
